May can often be a very busy month! We celebrate Mother's Day and remember Memorial Day, and with those occasions often come get togethers.

Our mothers are such a blessing to us and certainly worthy of celebration. However, there are some who celebrate Mother's Day by remembering a mother who is no longer with them. Memorial Day brings another occasion to remember those who we have lost, specifically those who defended and protected our freedoms. If you are reading this, I am not trying to bring you down but the truth is there are times in life when our hearts are heavy and to the point of breaking. We saw many of our folks struggling with their health and loss of loved ones in recent months.

As we look to May, I felt compelled to recognize that loss and heaviness. Though our hearts can be heavy at times I want to remind you of the words of Paul, in *1 Thessalonians 4:13-14, "But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope."* First, note that he does not say we do not grieve or mourn. Rather when we grieve, **we grieve with hope**. What is our hope? "For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep."

First, we have hope in the gospel of Christ. It is the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ that provides forgiveness of sin and the promise of eternal life for all who believe in him and call upon his name. Second, we have hope in the promise that our loved ones, who professed faith in Christ, are, even now, with God, and we will be reunited with them if we too believe. Yes, at times, we are all too aware of the brevity of this life. That awareness must compel us to share the gospel with those who are in our lives – it is our only hope in death. May our memory of those we have lost and the responsibility of living on beyond them drive us to make much of the time, as Jesus said in John 9:4, "while it is still day."

My prayer for you is not that God would keep you from mourning – but instead, in times of mourning, you are reminded of our hope, you are encouraged in the gospel, and you will be an ambassador of the ministry of reconciliation until your time on this earth is through. To God be the glory, forever, amen! - *Pastor Justin*


Men's Ministry

We will packing goody bags for the incoming summer counselors. This will be in the Davis Dining Hall at Camp Caraway.





You've probably asked yourself, *Is God really involved in the details of my life*? If you're like most of us, it's easy to believe that God is in the good things. He's surely in your successes, strong relationships, and good physical health. But you may wonder if He's also in your failures, broken relationships, and sickness. God news—He is!

Take note of an important distinction: God being in everything doesn't mean that He is *causing* everything that happens to us. After all, we live in a fallen world full of brokenness and sin. There will always be trouble to deal with on this side of eternity. So, while God doesn't *create* every circumstance we face, He does *allow* every circumstance. As He does, He's weaving the good parts and the difficult parts of our lives together for our long-term benefit and his glory.



Nothing we're dealing with has slipped by our sovereign God. Everything is under His control. When we choose to trust His ultimate goodness, we can both receive the joys of knowing that God is with us, for us, and always working for the good of those who love Him.

Romans 8:28-29 And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers.
